From 1993 to 1999 she was the founding editor of **Songs for Peace** Magazine, publishing over 100 songs and advocating peace, human rights and ecological responsibility. Sharleen was strongly influenced by the great topical songwriters of the 1960s, including Bob Dylan, Phil Ochs and Buffy Sainte-Marie. Her debut CD "So Frail" challenges us to question our leaders and ourselves on the issues of war and peace. Sharleen's songs are a bridge from outrage and despair to heightened awareness and active resistance. Her music echoes a growing movement for peace and justice now rising from every corner of the Earth.



**Mark Bodino** began playing guitar at age 13 and piano at age 18. He also noticed that he enjoyed the expressiveness of singing at age 18. Since that time, he has described his love for music as an obsession.
